



Khelafat Majlis Demands Referendum Ahead of National Election

At an urgent meeting of the Central General Council and Majlis-e-Shura of Bangladesh Khelafat Majlis, a demand for a referendum to implement the “July Charter” before the national parliamentary elections was raised. Speaking at the meeting, the organization’s Amir, Maulana Muhammad Mamunul Haque, emphasized that the opinions of leaders and activists at all levels must be considered before making any decision for the welfare of the country and Islam.

The meeting discussed electoral strategies and three options for the organization’s participation: contesting the elections independently, reaching an understanding with other Islamic parties, or joining the BNP-led alliance. All leaders present pledged unity in implementing any decisions taken.

Maulana Mamunul Haque further stated that, regardless of victory or defeat, candidates must remain by the people’s side for five years. Key points among the nine proposals adopted at the Shura session include: restoring full trust in Allah in the Constitution, prescribing punishments for the desecration of Islam, demanding a referendum, initiating international efforts to stop the persecution of Muslims in Palestine and India, and calling upon the global Muslim Ummah to work toward establishing the Khilafat.

Top leaders present at the meeting expressed full support for all decisions and pledged to work for the welfare of Islam.
