



Trump Gives Iran Another 60-Day Deadline

U.S. President Donald Trump has once again set a 60-day deadline to reach a final agreement with Iran, warning that Washington will consider alternative measures if a deal is not finalized within the specified timeframe. Speaking at Joint Base Andrews in Maryland, Trump said he still prioritizes a diplomatic solution to the dispute. However, he emphasized that the United States is prepared to take necessary action if negotiations fail. “We must reach a final agreement within 60 days,” Trump said. “Otherwise, steps will be taken that will not be pleasant for Iran.” The U.S. president also expressed hope that the situation would not reach that stage, adding that he believes the issue can be resolved through dialogue and negotiations. Notably, following the recent signing of a memorandum of understanding, Washington and Tehran are preparing to begin a new round of technical-level talks aimed at turning the framework into a comprehensive agreement. Against this backdrop, Trump’s latest remarks are being viewed as particularly significant.
