



BNP Submits Written Opinion on July National Charter Draft to National Consensus Commission



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The Bangladesh Nationalist Party (BNP) has submitted its written opinion on the draft of the July National Charter, which was circulated by the National Consensus Commission among political parties. After holding discussions with its allied partners in the simultaneous movement and conducting a detailed review, BNP submitted the response on Wednesday evening (August 20).

Party insiders confirmed that BNP, keeping in mind the upcoming national election, has made concessions in the draft proposal where necessary.

BNP Standing Committee member Salahuddin Ahmed told Kalbela, “We hope the July National Charter will be formulated, signed, and implemented on the basis of national consensus. However, certain proposals in the draft—such as giving the document supremacy over the Constitution and barring courts from questioning its legality—are not acceptable.”

He further stated, “We firmly believe that solutions can be achieved through dialogue within the framework of the Constitution and existing legal structure.”
