



European Union Awaits to Work with the Elected Government

EU Ambassador Michael Miller has said that completing reforms is essential for democratic transition, and the European Union will work closely with the government formed after the upcoming elections.

Michael Miller, the Ambassador of the European Union to Bangladesh, has stated that the EU wishes to further strengthen its ties with Bangladesh. He emphasized that reforms are indispensable for democratic transition and that the EU is waiting to work with the new government that will be formed after the February elections.

He made these remarks on Monday, September 15, at an exchange meeting organized by the Association of Former Ambassadors (AOFA) at the Foreign Service Academy in Dhaka.

Ambassador Miller said: “Bangladesh is moving towards a political transition. The EU will extend all possible support to the interim government to ensure a fair and free electoral process.”

He also called upon political parties, civil society, and development partners to work together in fulfilling the aspirations of the young generation.

In addition, he reaffirmed the EU’s commitment to investment, human rights, democracy, freedom of expression, security cooperation, legal migration, and the repatriation of Rohingyas.
