



Term of National Consensus Commission Extended Again Till October 31

The government has extended the term of the National Consensus Commission until October 31. Commission Vice-Chairman Dr. Ali Riaz stated that the signing process of the July Charter will be completed within the extended period. The term of the National Consensus Commission has been extended once again. The Cabinet Division issued a notification on Thursday (October 16) implementing the decision. According to the circular, the commission—formed on February 12—will now remain active until October 31, effective immediately.

Commission Vice-Chairman Dr. Ali Riaz said that all preparations for the signing of the July Charter have been completed within the extended timeframe. He expressed hope that all political parties will sign the charter tomorrow, Friday.

Notably, this marks the third extension of the commission's tenure. Previously, on September 15, it was extended for one month, and this time, for an additional 15 days.
