



Iran-Hezbollah Missile Attacks Across Israel

Tensions are rising in Israel amid ongoing missile, drone, and rocket attacks by Iran and Hezbollah.

According to local media, sirens have been sounding repeatedly in various parts of the country since Thursday (April 2), particularly in the Upper Galilee region. Channel 12 reported that at least three rounds of missile attacks were carried out on the same day, prompting alerts across large areas in northern Israel.

U.S. President Donald Trump claimed that Iran's capability to launch missile and drone attacks has significantly declined and that it now possesses only a limited number of launch systems. However, shortly after his remarks, an Iranian missile struck the port city of Haifa, according to Iran's state television. Trump also stated that the ongoing conflict could last another two to three weeks, though he believes it is gradually approaching its end.

It is worth noting that tensions across the Middle East escalated following joint U.S.-Israeli airstrikes on February 28. Reports indicate that nearly 2,000 people were killed in those attacks, including Iran's then Supreme Leader Ali Khamenei. In retaliation, Iran launched attacks targeting Israel as well as U.S. military bases in the Gulf region, resulting in casualties and significant infrastructure damage.
