



Four-time NFL MVP Rodgers to leave the Jets



Four-time NFL MVP Aaron Rodgers is set to leave the New York Jets, the team has announced.

Rodgers, 41, has spent two years with the Jets, but the quarterback suffered a torn Achilles tendon which disrupted his first season in a game against the Buffalo Bills.

Last season, Rodgers made history by having the third-best single-season totals in franchise history, which consisted of 3,897 yards and 28 touchdowns. "I personally want to thank Aaron for his time at the New York Jets," said chairman Woody Johnson in a statement released by the team.

"His arrival in 2023 was met with unbridled excitement and I will forever be grateful that he chose to join us to continue his Hall of Fame career.

It is reported that the Jets will be looking to bring in a new quarterback, as well as a new coaching staff. Currently, they already have Tyrod Taylor, Adrian Martinez and 2024 fifth-round pick Jordan Travis on the roster as quarterbacks.
