



Judiciary Must Keep Pace with Time: Chief Justice

Chief Justice Syed Refat Ahmed has stated that the judiciary cannot rely solely on the strength of tradition; it must adapt to the changing times. For this, effective reforms are necessary.

He made these remarks on Saturday (November 8) while delivering the keynote speech as the chief guest at the Diamond Jubilee and Reunion event of the Department of Islamic History and Culture at Dhaka University, held in the TSC Auditorium.

The Chief Justice further said, “The main aim of reforms is not administrative change but moral development. We must create a system that works not for power, but for serving the people.”

He noted that over the past fifteen months, various institutional reform initiatives have been undertaken to ensure the judiciary’s autonomy, improve efficiency, and make justice more accessible to the public. This process is still ongoing.

The Chief Justice emphasized that without timely and ethical reforms, the judiciary cannot stand as a symbol of public trust.
