



US rejects Israel's request over Iran deal

A new round of discussions has emerged surrounding a proposed agreement between the United States and Iran. According to a report by Israeli media, Israel had requested Washington to review the draft of the agreement, but the request was not accepted.

A report by Channel 12 said that the full details of the understanding expected to be signed in Switzerland on Friday are still not clear to Israel. This has raised questions among policymakers in the country regarding several provisions of the deal.

However, conflicting information has also emerged. A source connected to the matter stated that Israel did not officially make such a request. A US official also described the media report as inaccurate.

The official added that throughout the negotiation process, the United States has maintained regular communication and coordination with regional partners. Therefore, claims that Israel was kept completely in the dark do not reflect reality.

Various media reports suggest that the potential agreement may include easing some sanctions on Iran, normalizing shipping through the Strait of Hormuz, and addressing several regional security issues. However, none of this has been officially confirmed.

Meanwhile, President Donald Trump has stated that the agreement could be signed in Switzerland on Friday. So far, neither Washington nor Tehran has released the full text of the deal
